Polish Vocabulary for April

Kwiecień (kfyeh chehn) - April Wielkanoc (Vee ehl kah nohts) - Easter pisanki (pee sahn kee) - Easter eggs koszyk (kohsh ihk) - Easter basket baranek (bah rah nehk) - Lamb królik (krool eek) - Bunny lilia (lee leeah) - Lilly tulipan (too leep ahn) - tulip

święconka (shvee ehn tsohn kah) -Blessed Food - Easter brunch The food eaten at this meal is taken to the church in a decorated basket and blessed by the priest on Holy Saturday. It consists of ham, sausage, eggs, horseradish, salt, butter, bread, something sweet, and other foods that might be eaten by the family.

Polish Holy Week & Easter Traditions

The Polish people are very devout in their observance of Holy Week. Palm Sunday, Niedzela Palmowa (nee ed zhehla pahl moh vah) begins this most solemn week. Palms, willow branches or decorated sprigs of dried flowers and straw are taken to church to be blessed. They are then displayed in homes, often behind a holy picture as a prayer for health and prosperity. Holy Week, **Wielki Tydzień** (vee ehl kee tih djane) includes special devotions at church and in the home. Food is prepared, **pisanki** - eggs, are decorated, and the house is made ready for the holiday. On Holy Thursday, Wielki Czwartek (vee ehl kee chvahr tehk), church services are held in the evening, starting the three day remembrance of the Passion. Good Friday, Wielki Piątek (vee ehl kee pee ohn tek) commorates the death of Jesus. A tomb Grób Pański (groob pahn skee) is set up in each church with a statue of Jesus lying on the stone or being taken down from the cross. Parishoners stand guard at the tomb all night as people come and pray. Many travel from church to church to pray. Holy Saturday Wielka Sobota (Vee ehl kah soh boh tah), will find families taking their food baskets to church for a blessing and later in the evening attending the Easter vigil services. At the first meal of Easter, Wielkanoc, the blessed food is eaten after attending Mass. The meal begins with the sharing of a blessed egg; everyone takes a piece of the egg from the head of the household as they exchange best wishes with each other. The day is spent visiting with family and friends. Easter Monday, **Dyngus** (dihn goose) or Wet Monday is a day of sprinkling or dousing each other with water. This commemorates the day in 966AD when Poland became a Christian country due to the baptism of Prince Mieszko I.
